Halfway through the season and usually I summarise the performance of tippers. This year, for something a little different, I thought I'd summarise the performance of clubs instead. The table below shows what each team would have netted you, had you backed them to win each and every week.

What this table summarises is the discrepancy between the expected and actual performance of each club. Collingwood, for all their wins, are performing within expectations but Geelong are performing above and beyond theirs. In fact, even though Gold Coast are last on the ladder they would still have netted you an impressive \$16.50 in winnings! Their ROI (65%) is the best in the league, beating even Geelong, because they have played one game fewer than all other clubs. Western Bulldogs on the other hand...ugh.

Patrick's lead took a Clint Jones-like king hit after a pretty disastrous Round 12, allowing several tippers to close the gap he'd previously made for himself. Strangely, in a round where all favourites won, no-one got 8 from 8. The closest was Di who, for the second week running, got 7 out of 8 and gets another entry into the Second Chance competition.
