#### Some features:

- Rounds 6 and 17 (the traditional rival rounds) have the lowest total travel requirements across all teams
- Round 12 (split round) has the highest travel requirements; good planning on the AFL's behalf (for once)
- There are only 10 occasions in the entire fixture (and only 3 that are unintentional) where teams have to travel in back-to-back round. Again, unusually good planning by the AFL:
  - 3 of these occur across the split round
  - 4 of these occasions (Hawthorn, North Melbourne & Sydney x2) are due to teams electing to play a home match at a non standard stadium (Aurora Stadium, ANZ Stadium or Manuka Oval)
  - o Port Adelaide have 1 pair of consecutive away games at M.C.G and S.C.G
  - o Brisbane Lions have 2 pairs of consecutive away games, one at Etihad Stadium and the other at the M.C.G.
- Interstate teams have a significant disadvantage in travel requirements, especially Western Australian teams. And this is the way it ought to be, though Adelaide do have an advantage over their South Australian counterpart Port Adelaide who need to travel to the Northern Territory for 1 match

### My conclusions, with regard to travel requirements:

- Collingwood clearly have the easiest travel requirements of any team as the only team with 4 away games (compared to the average of 5.7 away games for Victorian teams) and 1,071 km less than their nearest opponent
- Hawthorn and Western bulldogs have the worst travel requirements amongst Victorian teams but these is self-inflicted with Hawthorn's 4 games at Aurora Stadium (Tas) and Western Bulldogs travelling to TIO Stadium (NT)
- Naturally, Western Australian teams have the highest travel requirements due to their isolation but I am awarding the hardest travel requirements to Brisbane as they have a high total travel distance, 2 pairs of consecutive travel requirements and as they do not get the advantage of a shared home stadium like Western Australian teams do, they have to travel 11 times in the season (equal highest with Sydney).
