Seems like Geelong are the after-the-siren magicians with 6 such victories including two from behinds and two consecutive occurrences in the 1994 finals series. But the thing that really pleases me about these statistics is that Carlton have lost by after-the-siren kicks more often than any other AFL team (7 occasions) including a mammoth 70m after-the-siren goal by Malcolm Blight in 1977 and another in 2002 when Carlton managed to claw back 44-points in the final quarter only to lose by a Geelong after-the-siren goal. Ahhh...demoralising Carlton losses are one of the two reasons why I enjoy AFL so much, the other being demoralising Collingwood losses.

There have also been several missed opportunities, including one in 1988 at Carrara Stadium where Footscray's Simon Beasley had a shot for goal from the boundary line after the siren to win. The Brisbane Bears placed Mike Richardson atop of Matthew Campbell's shoulders on the mark. The tactic worked, but prompted the AFL to change the rules.

Paul takes out this week's prize with his "last alphabetical" strategy redeeming itself from it's disastrous Round 15 performance. And before George starts his "would have, could have, should have" spiel (*Ed: Too late. It was the very first thing I heard as I walked into the office*) I'd like to point out how close Jesse and Hugh came to losing their leading positions, as each of Geelong, St Kilda and Richmond were a single kick away from losing in their respective matches.
