Ironic, but ultimately befitting, that the Gold Coast Suns' first game was played at night.




Move over Carlton and Collingwood...I reckon I've got a new scapegoat team for 2011

But let's return to the question of "just how crap are Gold Coast?" and break out some statistics on this bad boy:



The above graph shows the "progressive points margin" for Adelaide, Brisbane Bears, Fremantle, Port Adelaide and West Coast in their respective first years in the AFL (if you'd like to test your history of AFL see if you can match the teams and the debuting years to the lines; answers are over the page). The gray shaded area shows the typical (75% confidence) interval based on all team scores since 1987.

Gold Coast are down 119 points after one round meaning they lie at the 0.5% percentile point of performance. Even though their 7 goal score was about 7 more than I expected they would get, their losing margin eclipses (*get it?*) all other debuting scores of any club, including University back in 1908. In fact, only 23 out of 4,077 matches since 1987 have had a 119 point or more winning margin.

So, the answer to the original question is "very".

¹ I said "it would be mean of me to single them out". This is equivalent to "logical implication" also written $A \square B$, where A = "me singling you out" *implies* B = "I am mean". But since B is true anyway, $A \square B$ is a perfectly valid and consistent statement regardless of A.
