Congratulations to Josh who managed a perfect-8, for the second time this season. Could have been a hat trick too had he submitted his tip for Hawthorn v Western Bulldogs in Round 14.

Geelong thrashed Western Bulldogs by 101 points. That's got to be close to a record, no?

Schizophrenic personality: *Not even close. In Round 17, 1979 Fitzroy belted Melbourne by 190 points. In fact, there have been 202 rounds where the greatest winning margin has been more than 101 points:*

OK. But Collingwood swarmed on Essendon by 98 points and Fremantle sunk Sydney by 89 points as well. That makes three thrashings. Surely no other round has shown that level of collective thrashing...

Round 20, 1992 trumps that too:

True, but Round 4, 1979 actually had an even bigger thrashing AND a draw!:
